Role Profiles

Here at Machynlleth Comedy Festival we are extremely proud of our team, and they come from far and wide to be involved in the festival! We have attracted super enthusiastic, professional and caring volunteers and we are looking to expand that family!

Please note, all volunteers are required to work shifts on all three days of the festival, but shifts vary to make sure you manage to experience the festival from both sides. It is also necessary for volunteers to attend the crew briefing (followed by meal and drinks) on the evening of Thursday 30th April.

Volunteer Stewarding

Being a steward at Machynlleth means you really are the welcoming face of the festival! You will be assigned to one of the festival venues and be required to make sure all audience members get in and out of the venue safely. By the end of the weekend you will know exactly where the toilets are, fire exits and the nearest place for the audience to get a drink.

You will report to your Venue Manager and the Volunteer Manager.

Sound fun? Previous experience working with the public in a fast-paced environment is a must. You will need to be confident, welcoming and work well under pressure

Volunteer Runner

If you're looking to gain experience in a production environment then being one of our festival runners could be for you. The festival site is roughly 500m by 500m, and yet what we cram in to that space has grown enormously over the years, therefore runners are essential to help keep everything moving over the weekend. You'll be fit and energetic as you'll primarily be asked by production and managers to get things from one place to another. These could be small items of technical kit, to box office door lists. Working closely with the Production Team you'll be ever-ready to get on your bike (possibly) and help-out.

You will report to the Production Office

Sound fun? A great way to gain your first experience with the festival. You'll need to be up for a challenge and always ready to help.

Volunteer Box Office

Our box office is the hub of the festival and provides punters with not only the opportunity to purchase tickets for all of the shows at the festival but it is also the face of the festival, providing guidance and advice to make sure everyone makes the most of their time in Machynlleth. Housed in the Owain Glyndwr Centre you'll be at the heart of the festival, and welcoming people with a warm smile.

You will report to the Box Office Manager.

Sound fun? You need to be confident handling cash, be super organised and have a good knowledge of the festival programme. All this needs to be delivered with a big smile!

Volunteer Information Point Team

Our information points aim to provide answers to any and all queries from attendees. You will have a good knowledge of the festival as a whole, the UK live comedy scene **or** the town of Machynlleth. If you don't know the answer it will be your job to find out. You will be enthusiastic, happy to help and good at conversing cheerily with all-comers, as you are very much on the front-line of the festival.

You will report to the Information Point Manager.

Sound fun? Experience in customer focused roles preferred but not essential. Most important is a willingness to help, and an enthusiasm for the event.

Artist Liaison Team

Our artist liaison team make sure all our acts are signed in, happy and comfortable when they are on stage and for the rest of the weekend. The role requires a calm temperament, a great deal of organisation and problem-solving, whilst remaining professional at all times.

You will report to the Artist Liaison Manager.

Sound fun? Previous experience working with live acts is preferred.

Stage Management (Management Team)

Venue Managers are responsible for the day-to-day running of the venues. It is your responsibility to ensure safety of the public, the performers and our volunteers. The venues range in size but all are consistent in their professionalism and the strong customer service they give.

You will report to the Production Manager.

There are also a number of assistant venue manager positions.

Sound fun? You need to be confident, have good experience working in live venue environments and have some experience managing volunteers.

Production Office/Festival Control (Management Team)

We are looking for a super-organised, super-calm under pressure individual to join our production office team. You will have experience of working in production at a festival or arts venue. Please indicate on the form if this might interest you.
